The commercial holiday season blends All Hallows Eve, Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years. I heard someone refer to it this year as the season of "Hallothankmas." I thought it was funny, and true. It really does feel like that some times. Our commercial culture has tremendous power over our lives. Which isn't all bad. Commerce is a big part of being human and of what connects many of our relationships, not to mention putting food on the table. I actually enjoy all the crazy stuff that goes on, as silly and glib as much of it is, it is an attempt to celebrate the sacred and transcendent stuff of being alive.

For the Church this season, or series of sacred events, is much more articulate and connected to the sacred history of God in and for the world.
