I've told the story before. Years ago during a health crisis I passed some quick fatherly advice to my son just encase things didn't turn out so well, I had to come up with something pretty quickly, "Be sure to die with a thankful heart."

I think it made a bigger impression on me than anybody else, just speaking the words seemed to change something, the heart beat differently afterwards. Thanksgiving comes up in the oddest places sometimes. It's much more than a pleasantry, it comes with a shift and deepening of perspective. It means leaving who we used to be behind, it can be a sort of dying.

Thank you for my sabbatical, the gift of time came with some eye opening and some heart changing. Thank you also for having me for your priest for now just over 20 years, that gift of time has come with much eye opening and much heart changing as well.

During these years I've seen Jesus in you. The good news of God shows in you.

I know this sounds strange, but the majority of my ministry here has been with those who are dying and the families and the community in grief, hundreds of funerals of those I've known and loved. It has been an overwhelming honor. It has been a turbulent time for our country and the world over the past twenty years, but I've been so immersed in things that involve death, that I honestly couldn't give it much attention, and most of the time my thoughts about current events have been that we are paying attention to the wrong things. Life is shorter than we want and pain wears us down, and God is found in our flickering lives, and finding the Holy One always draws us back to love and thanks. We rage and storm about the wrong things.

Ok, so I've gone down the rabbit hole with this letter, thanks for indulging my flight.

Some Other Things of Note:

Rodney Cleveland, our much loved organist and choir master, is moving on this month. I will really miss him. And I am thankful for the time we have shared together. He isn't going too far away though...

School starts really early this year, prayers and hopes and dreams as we send our children back to school.

Live with a thankful heart,




